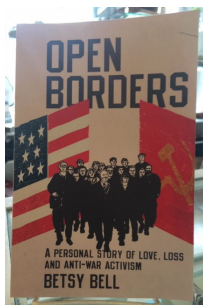

Saint Mark's parishioner Betsy Bell will lead a talk about *Open Borders*, her memoir about her family's involvement in the anti-nuclear war Seattle-based movement known as Target Seattle (1982-1984.) Betsy traveled to the USSR in 1983, a low point in Cold war relations. Hear about her search for peace and reconciliation across international divides and the personal toll her activism

took. Join us for cookies and coffee. Joining her will be Dick Carter, author of an essay included in the book; and Elena Campbell, professor of history at the University of Washington, who specializes in memory as an historical research resource.

Bishop Rickel's visitation to Saint Mark's is next Sunday

NOVEMBER 18, 9 AND 11 A.M. SERVICES

A "visitation" is the bishop's official pastoral visit to a congregation of the diocese. Diocesan bishops visit each congregation in their diocese at least once every three years. The purposes of this visit are for the bishop to examine the condition of the congregation, oversee the clergy, preach, confirm, preside at the Eucharist, and examine parochial records. As part of this visit, Bishop Rickel will preside over baptisms, confirmations, receptions into the church and the reaffirmation of baptismal vows.

A Commemorative event for Seattle civil rights leader Edwin T. Pratt

FEBRUARY 2, 2019, *Cathedral Nave*

Edwin Pratt was the Executive Director of the Urban League in Seattle in the 60s, and he was a devout Episcopalian. Pratt was a civil rights leader and was assassinated on his front doorstep for this work. The case was

never solved. His ashes are in the columbarium at Saint Mark's, and to this day his funeral remains the largest in Saint Mark's history. Along with several faith partners, the Seattle Urban League and the Pratt Arts Center, Saint Mark's Cathedral is planning a remembrance of Mr. Pratt on February 2. More details to come.
